## How will parents know?

You may receive a **text**, **phone** or **email message** from the school informing you of an emergency at school.

Go to the district website for updates: www.washk12.org.

We may also use media such as TV or radio to update you.

Please do not call the school as it may interrupt the emergency response and recovery efforts.

Students will be instructed to **not** use cell phones other than to send you a quick text message such as: The school has closed. Please pick me up at 2:45. Bring photo ID.

## How will students be released?

Listen for an announcement that it is time to pick up your child.

Park in designated areas. Do not abandon vehicles.

Follow signs to a "Check-in" area.

Fill out a Parent Reunification card for each child & show photo ID.

You will be directed to a "Reunification" area.

Your child will be brought to you.

In some cases, high school students may be excused on their own.

There may be instances where a student may not be allowed to remove a vehicle from the parking lot.

Please note that this reunification may occur at a site other than the school.

#### **QUICK RELEASE:**

The emergency may warrant a QUICK RELEASE. If so, parents may pick up their children from the child's teacher at the child's outside classroom door, or other designated areas. Please follow the signs.

## Everyday Safety: Checking In & Checking Students Out

All visitors are required to sign in at the front office of any school in Washington County School District.
